# The P.L.A.Y. Project (Play and Language for Autistic Youngsters)

This project recognizes the importance of parents as their child's best PLAY partner. The Home Consultant Program provides training and support to families of young children (18 months through kindergarten) with autism. Consultants teach parents techniques that are fun, effective and useful in every day interactions with their child.

Home Consultants focus on helping children with Autistic Spectrum Disorders (ASD) build emotional connections and engage in meaningful relationships with their family and others.



The DSC Consultants have extensive training in the PLAY Project Model. This program will also put you in contact with other therapies and services that may be helpful.

Free developmental screenings are available for children age *birth to three* through DSC's Family Development Center.

# <u>Do You Have a Concern about Your Child?</u>

Screenings provide a quick and simple way to monitor and measure a child's healthy development.

### What is the Purpose of a Screening?

A screening is used to address developmental questions parents may have and to determine if further assessment or evaluation is recommended.

### What Takes Place During a Screening?

Your child will be observed for development in four important areas: Personal/Social, Fine Motor Skills, Gross Motor Skills, and Language Skills.

### Where Does Screening Take Place?

Screenings are usually done in the child's home, but can also take place at a Daycare Center or DSC. A parent or guardian will be present and participate in the screening.
