# A Message from Chief Executive Officer, Dale Morrissey...

Happy New Year!

It's a new year and we are eager to achieve more milestones in 2017. Looking ahead, we are resolute in our commitment to a number of issues we will continue to address, advocate, and lead in this new year. Our efforts in each of these areas will be enhanced by self-advocates and staff critical to fulfilling our mission, as well as DSC's board and management team that will ensure the leadership and support as we move forward.

Additionally, I am humbled and eager to serve as the Chair of the board for the Illinois Association of Rehabilitation Facilities (IARF) further increasing my involvement at the state level. Our collective efforts will lead the way for each issue we will be addressing.

As we look to the state of the state in 2017, we are eager to continue to impress upon our lawmakers the importance of not only passing a budget for the State of Illinois, but also for a critically needed increase in the rates for all organizations across the state, given none has occurred in nearly a decade. To this end, we will further advocate, and ask for your support, in our [statewide] effort to increase the wages for Direct Service Professionals (DSP) who are critical to the foundation of the disability service system. The average pay for a DSP in Illinois is a meager \$9.35 an hour, an amount that is less than the federal poverty level for a family of three. As we have been stating for months, the DSP shortage is at a crisis level and an increase to a living wage is paramount.

As we draw on fiscal year '16, it is amazing to collectively reflect on the great accomplishments consistent with DSC's mission that have positioned us well for further achievements in 2017. Despite the absence of a state budget for the entire fiscal year, DSC remained steadfast in its commitment to people with disabilities with a focus of increased community and employment opportunities. We are proud of strengthened collaborations in our community and a noticeable shift in service delivery within our own organization with support from local funders that includes the Champaign County Developmental Disabilities Board, the Champaign County Mental Health Board and the United Way of Champaign County. We will continue to build on the successes of these exciting initiatives and will share new ones with you as they unfold.

In closing, we would like to pay tribute to the DSPs that work incredibly hard every day to make a difference in the lives of people with disabilities. Whether they have been with us for years or just recently joined our team, DSC recognizes that our DSPs are deserving of great recognition and respect for helping people to live meaningful lives, achieve personal goals and dreams, and work toward greater independence. Our talented management team supports their efforts daily while keeping an eye on what lies ahead and leading a transformation that challenges us, encourages us to take risks, allows us to make mistakes, and pushes us to be our very best.
