Spring has been a season of action and connection at DSC. Advocacy efforts were front and center, with two groups traveling to Springfield to support Direct Support Professionals (DSPs). Our self-advocates participated in the "They Deserve More" Advocacy Day in April, while staff attended the IARF Advocacy Day in May. We met with legislators to advocate for increased DSP wages and to oppose cuts to DSP funded staff support hours in group

homes. We're pleased to report the state budget reflects an increased wage for DSPs and delays group home hour reductions until January 1st.

We are also incredibly grateful for our volunteers. In April, 40 individuals helped see the runners off at the starting line of the Christie Clinic Illinois Race Weekend, and in May, several groups donated their time for spring clean-up projects at our group homes. Your support makes a real difference—thank you!

Our March Art Supply Drive saw wonderful support as well. The donated materials will be used for creative projects and enrichment activities by the people we support! Thank you to everyone who contributed, we appreciate you!

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Sitting Tall: How Adaptive Equipment is Empowering Finley

Since September 2023, DSC has been supporting Finley and his family through their early intervention journey. They have encountered some challenges, particularly in accessing the adaptive equipment essential for Finley's development. He had outgrown standard infant seating, and most toddler options required more core strength than he currently has. Until recently, his only seating options were a reclined swing or someone's lap with constant physical support.

Because of a generous grant from The TJX Foundation, DSC was able to add a specialized seating system to our Family Development Lending Library—giving Finley the support he needs. With this adaptive seat, Finley can now sit upright independently, engage in play with his siblings, strengthen his motor skills, and take part more fully in daily family life—all without requiring continuous hands-on assistance.

"This may sound a little dramatic, but this chair is going to be life changing for him. He was able to see what he was playing with without anything around his neck!" - Finley's Mom

This grant from the TJX Foundation also made it possible to add many other assistive devices and adaptive technology to our lending library, expanding our ability to support many more children. The lending library serves families who are facing delays in insurance approval or financial barriers, ensuring that children can continue progressing toward their developmental milestones without unnecessary interruption.

Vibration, Strength, and Smiles

Thanks to Iroquois Federal Foundation, who recently provided grant funding, DSC added the Hypervibe Gio Mini vibration plate and step/mat combo to our lending library—and one little boy is already seeing benefits.

This assistive technology supports muscle strength, balance, and mobility—especially for children with muscle tone challenges. With the Hypervibe, this child can now engage in fun, structured activities that help him build the muscles needed for crawling, standing, and walking. The step/mat combo allows him to safely explore different positions like hands-and-knees and tall kneeling, all while developing critical postural strength.

We are so thankful to the Iroquois Federal Foundation for helping us make these meaningful moments possible.

"Our son has really enjoyed using the Hypervibe—the sensory input is one thing he particularly enjoys. I feel like I am seeing an increase in his core strength and stabilizina muscles. This translates into better stability with running. climbing, and even possibly help with improving some of his speech. We appreciate the opportunity to be able to use this equipment with his therapy to see how he responds to the vibration therapy." - Mom
